He was also the top placing American in Calgary at the World Championship Blacksmiths Competition in 2013, and has won the Capewell Cup at the American Farrier's Association annual convention and contest.

Cody became the youngest AFA Certified Farrier at fourteen years old and was a Certified Journeyman Farrier by fifteen. In 2009 at the age of seventeen, Cody received a Diploma of the Worshipful Company of Farriers, and continued on to earn an Associateship of the Worshipful Company of Farriers at nineteen.

Anyone who has spoken to Cody at length knows how much he values competing. He'll tell you about how much you learn from practicing and that striving to meet a goal helps you grow. His continuous journey to create the perfect tools for competing and day-to-day use has given him a unique perspective on tool making.
